

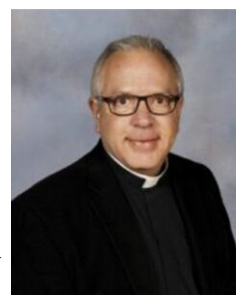

Three years ago, I prayed that we as a parish would recognize the blessings that God has given to each of us.

Would we be reminded as Gabriel had called upon Mary, that we could also be the symbol of Love, Compassion and Stability? Could we accept the challenge as a parish to demonstrate the Dignity, Grace and Generosity to have a successful campaign?

As we bring the *Hail, Full of Grace! Cathedral of the Assumption Capital Campaign* to a close, it is with gratitude and humility that I share such good news. By the Grace of God, we have successfully surpassed our goal of \$3,018,301.00 for the Vision Component of our Campaign. We will continue to schedule the planned improvements and repairs to the Cathedral's campus as proposed. We are working closely with the Archdiocese, local contractors, and the parish staff to be responsible stewards of our financial responsibilities.

Moreover, our received pledges for the Archbishop Thomas C. Kelly Permanent Legacy Fund indicate that 86% of the \$3,000,000.00 goal has been achieved. We have heard our call and answered it well. The time will come to align with the Bishop Flaget Society as the community of parishioners to promote and encourage the ongoing planned giving for the Cathedral. Anyone who previously or currently has a pledge of planned giving or has contributed to the Legacy Fund is a

member of the Bishop Flaget Society of the Cathedral of the Assumption. You will be receiving more information in the coming months.

Finally, it is my esteemed pleasure to mention the committee members who individually served this Campaign so well: Dr. Rick Adrio, Tony Hammond, Tim Tomes, Don Kavanaugh, Angela Wiggins, Maggie Cyphers, George Kaissieh, Leslie Smart, Fr. Michael Wimsatt, and Fr Martin Linebach.

It has been my honor to work with all these fine people, and I carry their friendship for the rest of my life. 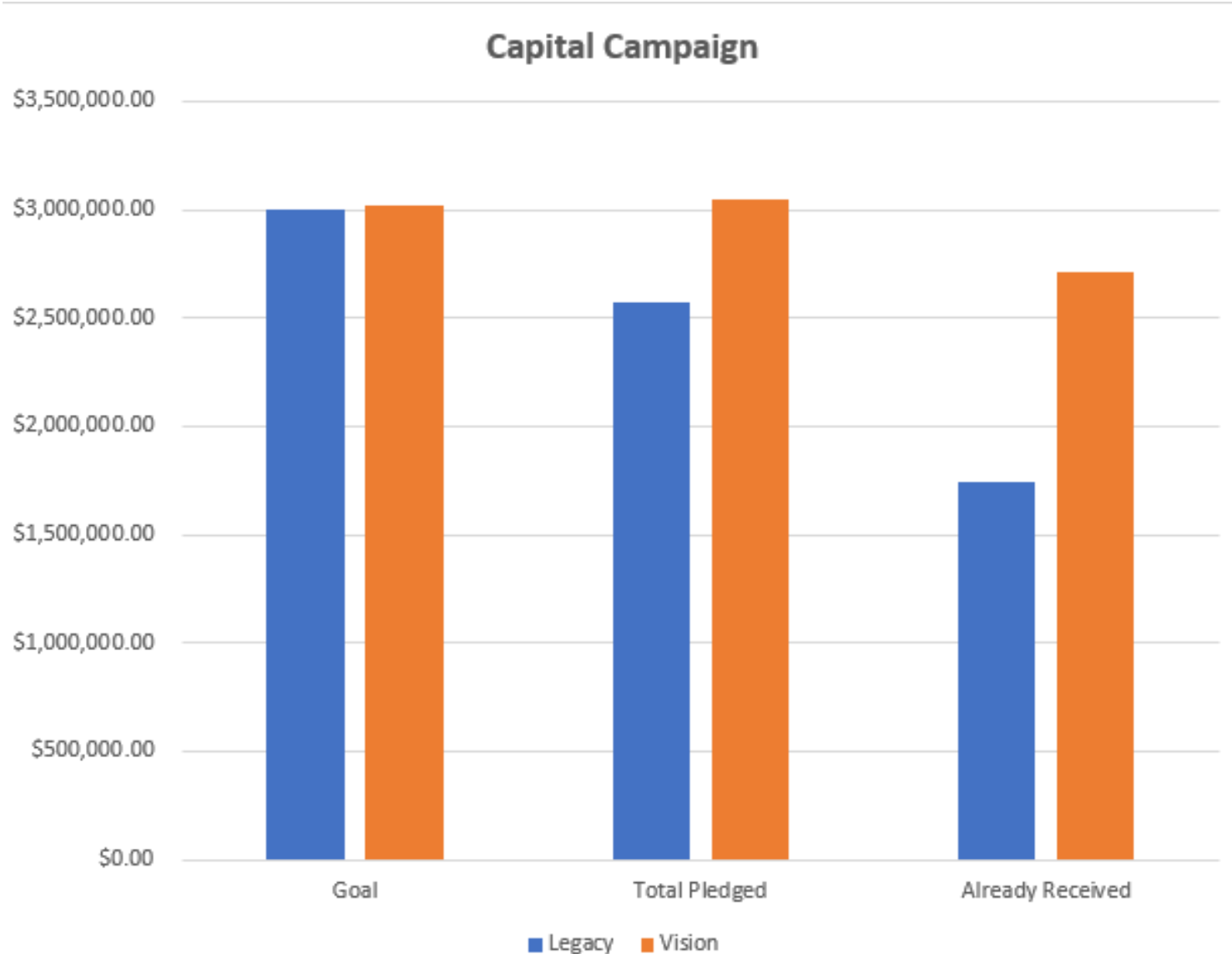

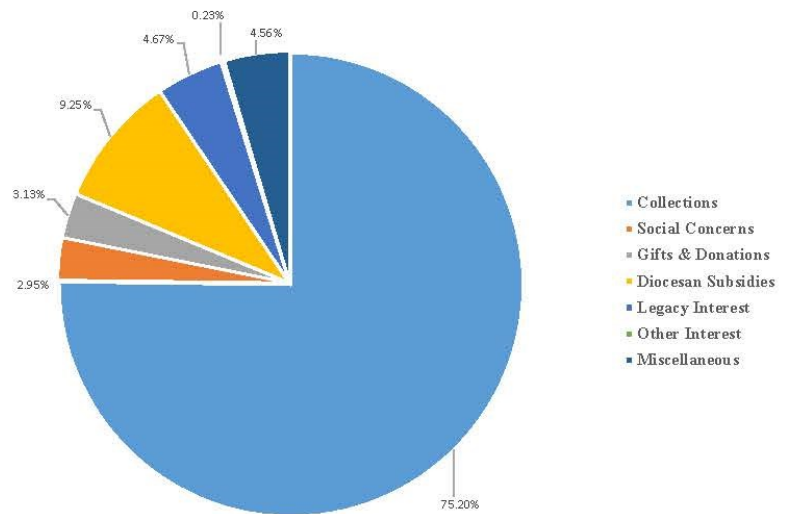

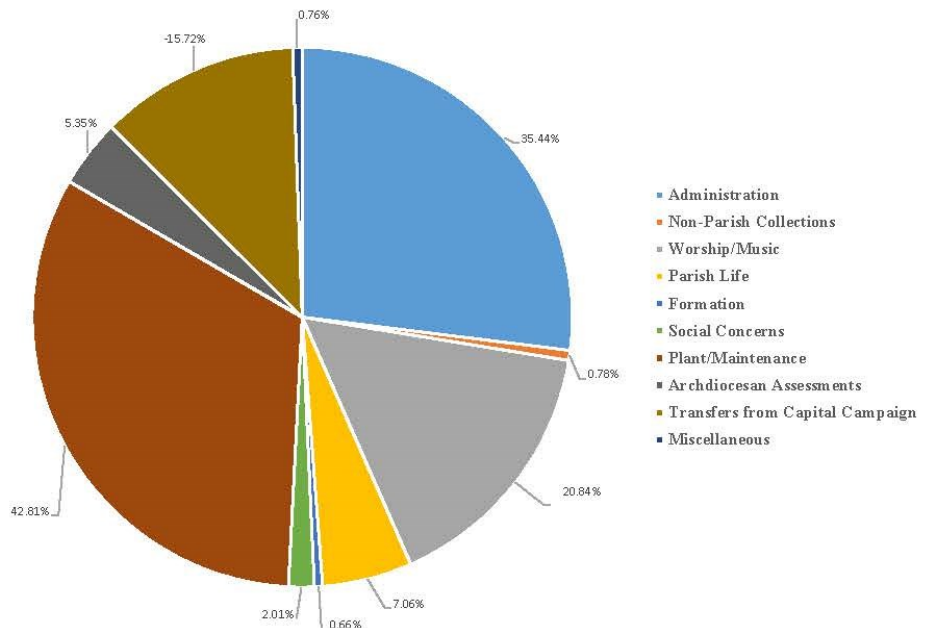
Fiscal Year 2022

Daily Lunch Program

For calendar year 2021, we have served a total of 13,870 guests through the end of September. Daily numbers before we opened the kitchen total indoor seating in June were at about 45/day. Since then has averaged 60-65 with some higher numbers in October not reflected. The average number of guests from January - September was 51. Kitchen Manager Paul Tadatada offers thanks on behalf of the Cathedral to Derby City Gaming, Gallrein Farms, Panera Bread, Dare to Care, Vincenzo's, Kroger, and Honey Baked Hams for their amazing support.

Vouchers for State IDs Issued

from October 2020 through September 2021: 128

In addition to limited access to government offices due Covid, this fall, the Driver's License/ID system changed from being issued locally by Jefferson County Clerk's offices to state offices, requiring a different process for our vouchers to be acceptable. The new system went into effect last month. Social Services Coordinator Joe Best collaborated with the state as well as staff from St. John's Center, UP for Women and Children, and the Coalition for the Homeless to ensure that vouchers from the Cathedral would be valid for clients to make application for state IDs.

The weekend when parishioners could select a Nativity Academy angel to shop for, we ran out of angels before our last Mass. The offertory collection at Thanksgiving Day Mass filled basket after basket with hats, gloves, and sweatshirts for our daily lunch guests.
